- Budget still looking great participation is really high right now and we are still receiving higher reimbursement that normal.
- With the new USDA waivers extending free lunches and higher reimbursement rates through next school year, it will likely be another year of budget success.

### Char Trejbal, Transportation Supervisor, reports:

- Excited to report that we received the EPA 2020 grant for Diesel Emission Reduction. The grant is for \$20,000 to scrap and help replace an older bus (2006 65 passenger International).
  - o Proposal for purchase of a basic 77 passenger diesel school bus for Schetky Bus (Thomas)
  - o Proposal for purchase of a 24 passenger diesel Thomas bus with 3 wheel chair stations.
- Spring Ridership Count
  - o High count 913
  - Low count 893
  - Mid count 907- This count will be reported to OSPI only 2 students less than March 2020
- Sub Bus Drivers
  - Training a new substitute will be ready for testing May 17<sup>th</sup>
  - Need to have two or three more

# Jody Sweeney, School Psych/SpEd Director, reports:

#### Overview

- Will be hiring a full-time Special Ed Teacher at the high school, SpEd secretary, 2 paras
- Transitioning to a full week for our secondary students.

### Area of Focus

- Planning next year's trainings, initiatives, and working with the Leadership Team as we look ahead to next school year and the future for sustainability. All of these fit "under" the MTSS umbrella.
- MTSS Multi-Tiered Systems of Support is essentially an umbrella that encompasses everything
  we do for our students all the puzzle pieces that make up the education of each individual
  student.
- Finishing data collection regarding student progress and identifying summer programs to continue to assist the students in special education.

### Enrollment

• 118 students in Special Education at this time with seven students as initial referrals/evaluations.
