

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Hello Scottie Parents/Guardians/Families!

As I watch our students achieve in the classroom, in athletics, in the arts, and at club competitions, I am constantly reminded that there is plenty to be thankful for at Freeman High School. I believe that Freeman HS achieves consistent excellence in these areas because we have outstanding teachers, coaches and advisors; we have a supportive community; and we have students who are eager to improve. While impressive, there is one element of our FHS student community that continues to keep me awake at night; continues to cause me great dismay; and continues to become increasingly frustrating: the way some students choose to treat one another. Over the past seven school days alone, five instances of derogatory language used at/or around other students have been brought to administration's attention. Derogatory language and slurs are not tolerated at FHS. They are not slang; they are harassing, intimidating or bullying. While most students are not using inappropriate language, silence is often perceived as acceptance. We have worked to build a positive culture that respects all students through our POWER value work; our Student of the Month recognitions, our SEL activities, and our staff professional development; and we will continue to do so. We have fully investigated and assigned discipline to all instances of inappropriate language toward others; and we will continue to do so. I never expect students to be "friends" with all other students at Freeman, but I do expect students to respect the dignity of all other students at Freeman. I invite you to consider discussing with your student how he/she can help be a part of a solution concerning how students treat one another at FHS. If you need talking points for conversation, please feel free to contact us. As a school community, I believe that we can do much better. Go Dawgs! Jeff Smith


