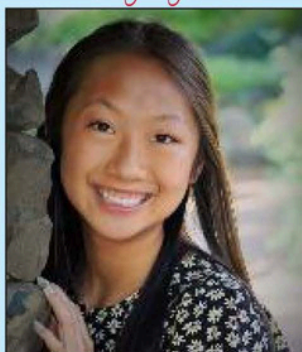

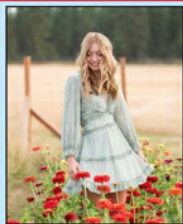

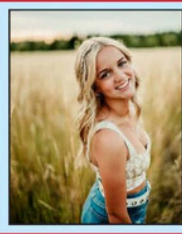

Class of 2026: Yearbook Senior Pictures & Tributes

***Senior portraits and kid pictures are due
October 15 for the 2026 Yearbook!***

Submitting Senior Photos - both kid and senior portraits.

In order to receive the highest quality image, **we are requesting that you submit your photos on-line** this year (see directions below). Many studios will be able to do this for you. The senior portrait must be 2"x3" (vertical orientation) and at least 300 dpi. Scanned kid pictures should also be 300 dpi and approximately 2"x3". They can be any photo of your student starting from birth to whatever age you prefer/have access to a photo.

Deadline to submit **both** these photos to the yearbook is **Tuesday, October 15.**

Directions to upload your photos:

- A. **RENAME** before uploading your photo so that we avoid misnaming your senior. Please save the image as a full size save and rename the photo as follows: Student's firstname_lastname (ex. Jenny_Smith) and your kid portrait to firstname_lastname_kid (Jenny_Smith_kid) so that it is easy to identify photos.
- B. Next, go to <https://yearbookshare.com/eShare/?code=dawgcountry> . School code for Freeman is dawgcountry
- C. You will be asked to put in your name, email and phone number.
- D. You will then be asked to "Agree to Terms", which is typical.
- E. You will then be asked to browse to your photo. Simply navigate to where you have the photo saved, select the photo, and click on upload.
- F. You are almost done - it will then ask for some information about the picture, such as who is in it - please type in your child's name (we default to your student's given name in the yearbook. They may see me if they'd like to use a preferred name instead per state law). That's all there is to it!

Senior Tributes: If you are interested in purchasing a tribute, or "shout-out" for your child or grandchild, please see the reverse side of this flyer for information. You will be able to submit photo(s) and a message for your senior in the yearbook! What a great way to say something special that will last a lifetime! Hurry though - space is limited! **We sold out last year! To reserve your spot, simply contact Ms. Longinotti with the size you would like, or purchase your tribute through your student's account by October 31 to reserve your spot and send in your info.** Content for your tribute is due on Dec. 1. 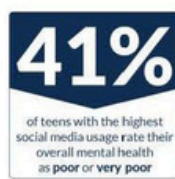
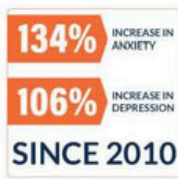
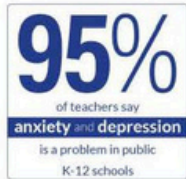

Why are we going cell-phone-free?

- Phones are interrupting student learning
- 40% of 8–12-year-olds and 95% of teenagers are on social media
- Teens spend nearly five hours a day on social media apps

Freeman High School Cell Phone Policy

- High school will be cell phone-free during classroom time.
- Other cell-based devices, such as smartwatches, air pods, etc., also will not be allowed to be used during classroom time.
- Students with specific medical or other documented needs may have accommodations made on an individual basis.
- High school students may use their cell phone during meals and passing periods.

Daily Routine:

- Teachers remind students of the policy and expectations at the beginning of each class period.

Violation Procedure:

- One warning and redirection to store the phone in their locker or designated location.
- Continued violation results in non-confrontational device surrender request.
- Teacher may seek support from Administration

Device Confiscation:

- Student will walk their phone down to the Main Office and give to administration or other office personnel.
- Confiscated devices will be stored in a secure location in the office for end-of-day pickup.
- 2nd office referral, parent/guardian will be notified that they need to pick up their child's device.
- Escalated behavior may result in disciplinary actions in partnership with parent/guardian.

Repeated Violations:

- Creation of a plan with student and family/guardian.

Dear Scottie Students and Families,

As we gear up for another school year, we wanted to share important information about attendance. School attendance is absolutely critical for success and is an important life skill. We believe that students who develop solid attendance habits will be more prepared for life beyond high school and likely to be successful as employees. With that, we are required by law to take attendance every day, in every class.

Why Attendance Matters:

- Missing just 2 days a month (or 10% of school) can impact your student's chances of reading at grade level by the third grade (elementary) or graduating on time (middle and high school).
- School is essential for students to build friendships and learn how to exist in a community.
- Absences can signal problems like disengagement, academic struggles, mental health concerns, and other issues that require attention.

We have developed a system to track attendance wherein we categorize attendance in green, yellow or red zones as a quick and efficient way to keep students and families informed of school attendance performance. More information about that will be provided in September.

OTHER IMPORTANT ATTENDANCE REMINDERS:

- Pre-arranged absences are greatly appreciated and must be communicated by a parent/guardian. Please email our office at fhsoffice@freemansd.org or call in by phone (509-291-3721).
- Please excuse your student's absences prior to the actual absence or within 48 hours.
- Missing four (4) or more class periods during a school day counts as a full day absence (*per OSPI*).
- **Both excused and unexcused absences count toward a student's total absences** (*per OSPI*).
- BECCA law/procedure for excessive unexcused absences is included on the next page.

Thank you for taking some time to review our attendance procedures. We are excited to start another school year and look forward to seeing you soon! If you have any questions please don't hesitate to contact us.

Chromebook CAP

Optional Chromebook Assurance Program | Grades 6-12

As part of our learning program, the Freeman School District provides a Chromebook to all secondary students (Grades 6-12). This device is the property of the Freeman School District. **Chromebooks are issued to 6th-12th grade students in September and collected in June.**

Families have the opportunity to enroll in the district's **optional** Chromebook Assurance Program (CAP). While not mandatory, this insurance program is highly recommended as it provides coverage in the event the device is lost or damaged. Annual cost is **\$20 per student** for the school year. Families who choose to enroll more than two Middle or High School students in CAP will only be required to pay for two CAP enrollments to cover all district-owned devices in the family each school year. Defective devices will be replaced or repaired at no cost to the family. Fees must be paid **prior to 3 weeks after the first day of school.**

- To **opt-in** to the annual insurance program, there is a **\$20 fee** for the school year. Fees must be paid prior to **3 weeks after the first day of school.** To purchase insurance, access Online Payments at <https://wa-freeman.intouchrecepting.com>
- **Opting out of the program** means families will be held financially responsible for the full cost of repair or replacement associated with any damaged, lost or stolen equipment. A fine will be placed on student accounts for the cost of replacing or repairing the equipment.
- Lack of action prior to September 15th will be considered an opt-out.

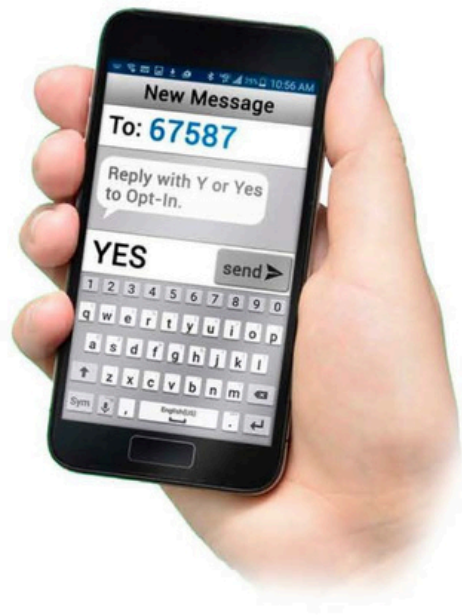

This method is fast, secure and highly reliable because it is strictly regulated by the wireless carriers and only allows access to approved providers.
