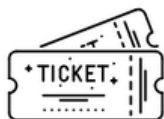

After the shoot off Austin won 2nd place and Drew won 3rd place.

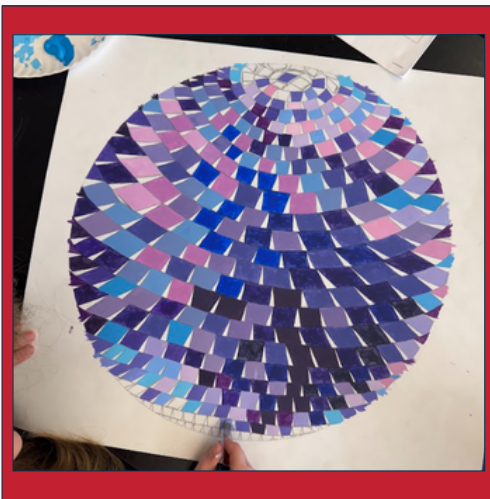
Maggie H was tied for 1st place Female with a score of 44/50.
